Ann J. Allen (nee Luca), 85, of Lorain, passed away Friday January 31, 2025 at her home after a long illness with dementia. She was born June 24, 1939 in Lorain, the oldest of 5 children to Steve & Stella Luca (nee Sirotar).

Ann graduated from Lorain High School in the 1957 B class. She married Dick Bobek on May 30th 1959, and started to build their family. Ann was proud of her large family. From her 5 children, 15 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren, she was always there to help when needed.

Ann worked multiple jobs during her lifetime. Early on she worked at the Hoop Restaurant. After marrying Dick, she was an Avon Lady, dental receptionist for Dr. Reber and finally retired after working many years with Lorain City Schools. In her spare time, she worked the fish fry at the American Slovak Home and at the Hallmark Store. She also volunteered at Mercy Hospital.

Ann was a member of St Peter Parish in Lorain and a member of the former Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Lorain where she was a member of the Holy Name Society.

Ann was a member of the 7Ettes, a group of seven lifelong friends from the Lorain High School Class of '57. They met regularly for dinners, fellowship and travel.

She was very proud of her Slovak heritage and the local Slovak community; she passed down many holiday traditions, love of Slovak food and dancing the polka to her children and grandchildren. She was a member of St. Ann's Lodge FCCLA Branch 114, where she volunteered as treasurer for many years.

She loved that Lorain was known as the International City. She hosted foreign exchange students for over 10 years, staying in close contact with Leo Chan from Hong Kong.

Ann had a passion for travel. Starting off with family camping trips across the USA to numerous international destinations, including a trip to visit family in Czechoslovakia. She also took numerous cruises, and visited many of the foreign exchange students.

In 2003 Ann married Jack Allen. Jack and Ann loved to go on casino bus tours, dancing at the Italian club, and taking summer vacations with her large family in South Carolina.

She loved crafting, gardening, crocheting, baking, cooking and decorating her children's birthday cakes. Ann also had many, many collections. She was involved in Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts and Indian Guides.

The family would like to thank Brenda and the staff at Griswold Home Care, Crossroads Hospice and her daughter Laurie who was always there for Ann in the last 5 years.

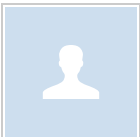

“ How do you say thank you and goodbye to someone who completely changed the course of your life? My host mom, Ann, made a decision in 1989 that altered my future forever. Even though all her children were grown, she chose to host another foreign exchange student—and because of that choice, my life was never the same.

Without her, I wouldn't have decided to go to college in the U.S., stayed, and eventually become a citizen. Without her, I wouldn't have met my wife. Without her, my daughter wouldn't have been born.

I still remember the day she came to Cleveland Airport to pick me up in 1989. She brought a couple of her grandchildren with her, welcomed me with a warm hug, and handed me a small American flag. From that moment on, she treated me like one of her own. I've always called her “Mom” because that's exactly how I saw her.

She took care of me during my time with her family—nudging me to go out more, study a little less, and encouraging me to make friends. Even when I got into a fight at school and was suspended, she treated me with patience and love. She brought me to church for Mass, included me in her children's weddings as part of the family, and shared with me the warmth of her home and heart.

I will never forget the amazing food she made. The first time I tasted baklava was when she spent an entire day making it. It was so good that I asked for it every time I visited. I remember bringing some back to my friends in my twenties—they were so impressed, just as I had been.

Even long after my exchange program ended, I stayed in touch with her and her family. Now, I'm around the same age that my host mom was when she welcomed me into her home, and I am truly in awe of how extraordinary she was. Opening your home to a stranger for a year is no small act of kindness. But Ann had a deep

curiosity about other cultures—she loved learning through both traveling and hosting foreign exchange students. She continued to host three or four more after me, and many before me as well. I know that all of us who were lucky enough to be her exchange students owe her a debt of gratitude.

I'm grateful that she was able to meet my wife and daughter again eight years ago, when her memory was beginning to fade but she still remembered us. It broke my heart when she lost her memory completely a couple of years ago, and now, as she has left us physically, I feel an immense sadness. But the memory of her will never be lost.

It will live on in her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. It will live on in all of us who had the privilege of being her exchange students—and in the children of those students.

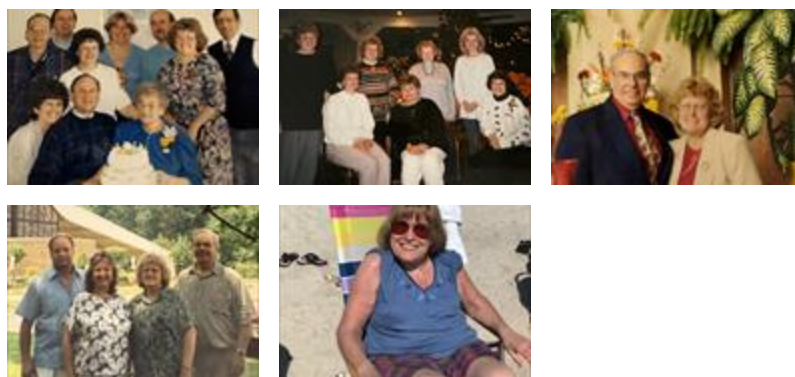
