



## Bruno "Jerry" Bennett

August 19, 1924 - August 16, 2024

Bruno "Jerry" Bennett died of natural causes on August 16, 2024. 3 days shy of his 100th birthday.

Bruno was born August 19, 1924 in Lorain to Joseph & Rose Bennett (nee Scarda) and was a life-long resident of Lorain except for the last 12 years where he lived at Independence Village in Avon Lake. He was married to his late wife of 78 years Minnie Bennett (nee Cambria), who died in 2021.

Bruno worked with his father and brothers at Bennett Fish Company on West Erie Avenue in Lorain. In 1942 he enlisted in the Marine Corps and fought in the South Pacific at the Battle of Guam and Okinawa. After the war Bruno worked for Lorain County. He and Minnie lived on Amherst Ave where they enjoyed their home, family, friends and traveling. Minnie and Bruno enjoyed going out dancing whenever possible with their friends. He was a life member of the Disabled American Veterans and a member of St Peter Parish.

Their son, Ronald Bennett (wife Tammy) own Headquarters in Lorain, Cleveland and Florida. Joanne Molnar (husband Ernie), their daughter, lives in Michigan where she retired as a high school principal. They loved family gatherings with their granddaughters Michelle Glenn (Florida), Allison Batt (N. Ridgeville) and Carrie Harvey (Michigan). They have 6 great grand children: Alex & Bret Harvey, Alexis & Sean Glenn and Nick & Frankie Batt. Bruno was

preceded in death by his parents Joseph and Rose Bennett and three brothers, James, Joe, Frank "Bill" Bennett and 2 sisters Mella Carek and Mary Lagana.

Private family funeral services were held at Gluvna-Shimo-Hromada Funeral Chapel in Lorain with Rev. Craig Hovanec, pastor of St Peter Parish, presiding. Burial followed at Calvary Cemetery where the Amherst Veterans Military Honor Guard conducted military honors.
