



## Jenifer M. Weaver

Jenifer Mary Weaver (nee Krupski), 67, of Lorain, passed away on April 28th, 2024 unexpectedly at her home. She was born on November 6, 1956, in Lorain, Ohio to her mother, Virginia Krupski and father, Dr. John G. Krupski. Jenifer was a graduate of Lorain High School and attended Ohio State University. After being raised in Ohio and spending a brief stint in Wisconsin, Jenifer moved to and spent a large percentage of her adult years on the Outer Banks of North Carolina where she raised her four children. After her children were older, she moved back to Wisconsin before permanently settling back in her hometown of Lorain.

Jenifer was a phenomenal chef and appreciated making and eating great food. She frequently shared recipes with those she loved and was the first person you'd call if you had a question about how to make a certain dish. Despite all the amazing meals she has cooked throughout her life, her most notable legacy has to be her pierogies and bagel, egg and cream cheese creation. She was a huge animal lover, especially dogs, and invested her time and energy into fostering dogs without a home; you'd often see her sharing petitions for animal rights and fair treatment on her social media. Jenifer was an intelligent woman who could beat anyone in a game of Scrabble; she enjoyed doing word games and crosswords and quickly solved puzzles without much effort. Jenifer had an effervescent spirit coupled with a sharp wit and great sense of humor and was one the most kind and generous souls

you'd ever encounter. She loved her family, especially her children and grandchildren, and made sure it was known – if it was in her power to help those she loved, she'd do it without question.

Jenifer is survived by her children, Jordan (Amber) Klein of Marathon, FL; Stephanie (Jeff) Ferris of Sparta, WI; Carley (Josh) Kenworthy of Bend, Oregon; her brother Brian (Cathy) Krupski of Pompano Beach, FL and her five grandchildren, Journie Ferris, Jourdan Ferris, Jackson Kenworthy, Penelope Kenworthy and Rose Kenworthy.
