



Lucio Mario Tamaro

February 23, 1930 - July 14, 2025

Lucio Mario Tamaro, age 95, of Sheffield Township, passed away peacefully at Rae Ann Suburban Nursing Home in Westlake on the morning of Monday July 14, 2025. He was born in Lorain on February 23, 1930 and had previously resided in both Lorain and Amherst prior to moving to Sheffield Township.

At the age of eighteen, Lucio joined the United States Army. He fulfilled duty assignments as a Private First Class attached to the 4745th Light Infantry Battalion and was the recipient of a Skilled Sharpshooter's medal; he visited China aboard a U.S. Navy vessel during one of his many tours of duty prior to his honorable discharge in 1949.

Lucio was a highly skilled excavator and had been the owner of Tamaro and Sons Construction for more than forty-six years prior to his retirement in 2000. Known by many as a real character and possessing a macho personality (his business card bore the title "Italian Stallion") he frequently solved problems "in his own way" obtaining results that were far better than if he had employed conventional solutions.

He maintained a colorful flower garden in front of his home which included sunflowers while his backyard garden was adorned with a multitude of plantings including black grapes and fig trees.

In his free time he enjoyed dining out and socializing at local restaurants including L & K and Big Boy in Amherst as well as the Farmer Boy in South Amherst. Most recently, he frequented the Blue Sky Restaurant, Wendy's and Ziggy's all in Amherst.

Lucio is survived by his sons Tony Tammaro, Joe Tammaro, and Vince Tammaro. Additional survivors include his brother Joe Tammaro and sister Amelia "Millie" Reph.

He was preceded in death by his former wife Dolores Tammaro (nee Kritz), father Antonio Tammaro, mother Filomena Tammaro (nee Pometto), by brothers Michael, Louis, and Steve Tammaro, and sisters Rosetta Nicholson, Matilda "Tilly" Jakubowski and Nancy Richardson.

Graveside services will take place at Calvary Cemetery (555 North Ridge Road, Lorain) at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday August 9th where military honors will be conducted by Amvets Post # 32 of Elyria.
