Robert E. Scott, age 71, of Lorain, passed away suddenly and unexpectedly at his residence on Saturday April 6, 2024. Bob was born in Lorain and remained a life-long resident of the city. He was a graduate of Lorain High School.

Shortly following his graduation, he joined the Lorain Products Corporation where he was employed as a production assistant until the time of his retirement.

Bob was an ardent sports fan and loyal follower of all three Cleveland professional sports franchises in his free time.

His passion for sports and especially, baseball, found him serving as a coach in the Lorain Youth Baseball program for many years. During that time he impacted the lives of countless program participants by enriching them in both athletic as well as life skills.

He is survived by sister Ellen Hevener of Stow along with sister-in-law Judy Scott and brother-in-law Wilbert "Butch" Balogh both of Lorain. Additional survivors include nieces Jill Balogh-Trupo, and Kara Schultz, M.D., nephews David Scott (Anne), Timothy Scott, Eric Balogh (Polly), Kirk Hevener (Dionne), and Kevin Hevener (Elizabeth), along with several great nieces and nephews.

He also leaves a host of devoted, dedicated, and beloved neighbors with whom he maintained a strong bond.

Bob was preceded in death by his father Forrest J. “ Bud” Scott, mother Margaret G. “Peg” Scott (nee Bigley), sister Barbara Balogh, and brother James David Scott.

We both worked for decades at Lorain Products Corporation on Lorain's East Side. When we would talk, there were two things we always talked about. 1) Family. His family was very important to him. Bob was a teenager when his dad passed away. Along with his siblings his mom (who also worked at Lorain Products), was well cared for by the Scott family. But Bobby loved to talk about his nieces & nephews. He would have such a smile on his face and he seemed to light up. I enjoyed hearing about their accomplishments even though I did not know them. 2) Bobby would always talk about baseball with me. When we were young he always wanted me to go to the neighborhood park and get a game up with the neighborhood kids. I would go, but I would rather ride my bike, put on a pair of roller skates, anything with wheels. After our time at Lorain Products ended, I did not see Bobby much. Occasionally he would stop by our home on Lorain's eastside to catch up. I enjoyed those visits. After retirement, my wife and I left Ohio. We still come home each summer to visit family. And I always would drive past Bobby's house because he lived just a couple of blocks from my childhood home that still belongs to my mom. I never stopped, although I should have. My plan was always to stop if I saw him outside. I did not want to stop unless he knew in advance I was coming. That was a poor decision. I regret not stopping to say hello. I will miss you my childhood friend. I always had much respect for you. I appreciate the life lessons I learned by taking time to listen to what you were doing in your life.
